

HOW TO GET THROUGH AND OUT OF THE ECONOMIC CRISIS

o you want to survive and be able to experience expansion while everybody else believes this is the worst economic crisis ever – and is set to last for the rest of their life? If your answer is yes, then follow these 3 steps:

RULE NUMBER ONE:

IF YOU KNOW YOUR HISTORY, YOU HAVE NO REASON FOR WORRY! The current economic crisis is just a repetition of the past. Don't you remember "Black Monday"? It refers to Monday, October 19, 1987, when stock markets around the world crashed. The Black Monday decline was the largest one-day percentage decline in stock market history. But all world stock markets rallied in less than 1.5 year.

War: huge peaks in oil prices, a steep decline in the commercial real estate market and a credit crisis (following the infamous savings and loan collapses of the late 1980s). This crisis ended in 1994 and world stock markets hit top values in less than 2 years.

And of course, in our recent past, the 9/11 attacks had a significant economic impact on the United States and world markets. The New York Stock Exchange (NYSE), the American Stock Exchange (AMEX), and NASDAQ did not open on September 11 and remained closed until September 17. When the stock markets reopened, the Dow Jones Industrial Average (DJIA) stock market index fell 684 points, or 7.1%, to 8921, a record-setting one-day point decline. By the end of the week, the DJIA had fallen 1,369.7 points (14.3%), its largest one-week point drop in history.

But recovery came faster than expected, world stock market hitting again unparalleled top levels within less than 2 years and continued to climb until 6-7 months ago.

So, the moral of the story? Crises always bring recoveries, and these come faster than many dare hope. I have personally lived and survived through 6 crises over the last 50 years. I have grown stronger and smarter out of each of them. And so have you, I am sure!

RULE NUMBER TWO:

IGNORE the bad news. Do not read or listen to the bad news in the papers, radio or TV. I am sorry to say, but listening to bad news, gossip and rumors will not do you any good.

You will find out that the mass media are

there are some! Good news brings good news. Insist on getting good news at least once a day! And also put your attention on giving your friends, your employees or your colleagues good news at least once a day.

I once advised a customer who did not know what to send out for promotion. He was concerned that his customers were complaining about his bi-weekly email newsletter. I told him "well, double it. Send them good news..." He took this by the letter and started to send his 20,000 customer base some success stories or good news from happy customers on a weekly basis. Nobody ever complained about it – and he "miraculously" started to make more money!

So, spread good news around, in life and in business. Suggest to people around you to do the same. Surround yourself with people who are "good news" – and you will soon see a big difference in your business... and in life. I like to live with the following principle: "One piece of good news a day keeps the trouble away!"

RULE NUMBER THREE:

GO NUTS on your promotional actions. Increase your reach to your market. This means, literally: increase your communications to your mailing list. Are you sending 1,000 promo pieces per week? Start sending 3,000 of them. Spend less money on quality and more money on quantity. During tough times, most people and businesses tend to introvert and reduce their reach out to the society or to their market. Don't do that, as it is a fatal mistake!

Warren was ranked by Forbes as the richest man in the world during the first half of 2008, with an estimated net worth of \$62 billion. In his recent interview he laughed when the reporter asked him why he wasn't worried about the current world crisis. His response: "I got rich also because I learned to disagree with the bad news..."

WHY IT'S IMPORTANT TO BALANCE YOUR CALCIUM INTAKE

by Peter Gillham

agnesium influences many bodily processes, including digestion, energy production, muscle function, bone formation, creation of new cells, activation of B vitamins and relaxation of muscles, as well as assisting in the functions of the heart, kidneys, adrenals, brain and nervous system. The lack of sufficient available magnesium in the body can interfere with any or all of these processes.

The National Institutes of Health, Office of Dietary Supplements, reports that there is an increased interest in the role of magnesium in preventing and managing disorders such as hypertension, cardiovascular disease and diabetes.

A Healthy Magnesium Level

Diets of the industrialized world, with their processed foods and use of refined sugar and flour, are commonly quite low in magnesium. The result? A significant percentage of the population have below healthy magnesium levels, including many who already use magnesium. Why? First, the amount of magnesium required by the body is greater than people think. Second, most magnesium capsules and tablets are not completely absorbed by the body.

Symptoms of Magnesium Depletion

Millions suffer daily from symptoms that can result from a lack of magnesium. Because magnesium is required for hundreds of enzymatic reactions (enzymes are protein molecules that stimulate every chemical reaction in the body), deficiency can cause a wide variety of symptoms, such as:

- Low energy
- Fatigue
- Headaches
- Anxiousness
- Nervousness
- ısness Irritability
- Inability to sleep
 Weakening bones
 PMS and hormonal imbalances
- PMS and hormonal imbalances Muscle tension, spasms & cramps
- Abnormal heart rhythms
- Weakness

What Depletes Magnesium?

Magnesium deficiency can be caused by a number of things, including—but not limited to—lack of adequate dietary magnesium, emotional stress, some drugs (diuretics, antibiotics, birth control pills, insulin, cortisone), heavy exercise, diabetes, gastrointestinal disorders and excessive calcium in the diet.

Calcium & Magnesium

Calcium and magnesium are two different sides of a coin. Calcium excites nerves while magnesium calms them down. Calcium makes muscles contract. Magnesium is necessary for muscles to relax. Calcium is needed for blood clotting but magnesium keeps the blood flowing freely.

It is easy to see that it is vital to keep these minerals in balance and that too little magnesium to balance calcium could be both uncomfortable and unhealthy.

Calcium deficiency can be a serious issue and has been heavily promoted through the media and advertising. While calcium is an important nutrient your body needs every day, too much calcium can be a problem. The hidden cause of calcium deficiency is the fact that available calcium is not being assimilated by the body due to a lack of magnesium.

Without a proper balance of these two minerals, magnesium gets depleted, which will result in the negative effects associated with lack of magnesium and a buildup of unassimilated calcium (see symptoms above).

In addition to the many calcium supplements on the market, calcium is now added to cereals, crackers, juice, antacids and other items (including soft drinks and chocolate). None of these products contain magnesium to balance the added calcium.

Women taking calcium supplements to prevent postmenopausal osteoporosis—without adequate magnesium—can actually lower the vital bone mineralization process.

Without sufficient magnesium, the nerve cells cannot give or receive messages and become excitable and reactive. This causes a person to become stressed, highly sensitive and nervous. Feelings of nervousness, irritability and being unable to relax are signs of needing magnesium.

For these exact reasons excess calcium can become a real problem, while excess magnesium, on the other hand, is not a concern. Unlike calcium, magnesium does not build up in the body—excess amounts are simply flushed out.

Jeanne Shapiro, who is on the committee for the clinic, is grateful to people like Frank Crum and Bonefish Grill. "It's truly a community event because we can't do it without the support of the restaurants, and the artists and our venue hosts, who all donate their services."

For one local artist, Ernest Simmons, this event had a very special meaning. When he was an eighteen year old starving artist, he was a patient at the clinic himself. "It was a great help to me back then so I like to give back to the clinic," said Ernest, who donated his painting "Wading in the Mangroves" to the event.







The score was 20 to 16, with the Steelers in the lead. Larry Fitzgerald received the pass down the middle from Kurt Warner, and booked it to the end zone, evading three Steelers hot on his tail. Touchdown! The conversion put the score at 23 to 20 with Arizona in the lead.

It looked as if the Cardinals were going to win with Larry Fitzgerald—the hero of the night. Except for the fact that there was two and a half minutes left on the clock, just enough for the Steelers to "steel" the game back. Santonio Holmes scored a miracle touchdown, gracefully keeping the ball in bounds by his toes, with only thirty-five seconds left in the game, making Arizona second best in the country. "My feet never left the ground. All I did was extend my arms and use my toes as extra extension to catch up to the ball," said Holmes.

If it were not for Holmes's toes, for his carefulness in making sure the play was still in bounds, Fitzgerald would have been the MVP, the hero who won the game and brought it home to the Grand Canyon state. But instead the glory went to Holmes.

"The game played out exactly how it was supposed to. Our defense stepped up when they needed to. They gave up some big plays, but at the same time, when they really needed to clamp down on that offense, they did just that," said Holmes of his spectacular victory. "It was definitely our destiny to win the Super Bowl."

The Steelers won 27 to 23, giving them a record-breaking sixth Lombardi Trophy - and a miraculous finish to one of the most spectacular Super Bowls in recent history.

NFL Commissioner Roger Goodell said it best, "What an incredible performance by both clubs. The Cardinals deserve a tremendous amount of credit for playing all the way and (having) a tremendous season. But it's the Steelers' night. It was a performance for the ages."


