upporters of Human Rights convened in North Straub Park on March 6th for the 4th Annual Human Rights Walkathon. They were there to celebrate the thirty human rights delineated in the United Nations Universal Declaration of Human Rights.


The purpose of the walkathon was to raise awareness for, and to educate about, these universal and essential rights. "People who know and understand their human rights will stand up not only for their own rights, but also for the rights of others," says creator of the walkathon and human rights advocate Linda Drazkowski.

Anna I. Rodriquez, founder of the Florida Coalition Against Human Trafficking and walkathon speaker, explains that attendees at the walkathon will go home and tell their friends, and those friends will tell their friends, spreading human rights through word of mouth.

The United Nation's Universal Declaration of Human Rights was adopted in 1948. It describes the thirty basic rights we all have simply because we are human, such as "All human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights," and "Everyone has the right to life, liberty and security

#### **PHILLIES "PAY BACK" THE YANKEES**

harlie Manuel, the manager of the Phillies, remarked earlier this year that the Phillies "owe the Yankees one." On March 4th, exactly four months to the day the Yankees won the 2009 World Series, the Phillies had a chance to have their "payback" with their first spring training game of the year at Bright House Field in Clearwater.

At a sold-out game, the Phillies got their revenge, beating the Yankees in a 3-2 victory. New pitcher Roy Halliday easily proved himself the star of the game, throwing 24 pitches in two innings, 21 of them being strikes.

Each year, while the northern states have yet to experience the thaw of spring, Major League Baseball heads south, with fifteen teams setting up camp in the Sunshine State, forming The Grapefruit League. The other fifteen Major League Baseball teams train in Arizona, forming The Cactus League.

Perhaps there's something in the waters of Tampa Bay, because in the past two years, all three teams to compete in the World Series have called the greater Tampa area home, whether it be part time or full time. The Philadelphia Phillies have been training in Clearwater since 1947; the New York Yankees train in Steinbrenner Field in Tampa; and the Tampa Bay Rays trained in St. Pete since the team's inception until recently when they switched to Port Charlotte. The Rays, however, call Tampa Bay home any time of the year. The Toronto Blue Jays are the additional Major League Baseball team to hold spring training in the Pinellas/Hillsborough area.

The Phillies will play the Yankees on March 8th and again on 26th in Tampa, and on March 17th and 22nd in Clearwater. For more information and tickets, visit phillies.mlb.com ◆

#### **CLEARWATER FOR YOUTH INVESTS \$1.5 MILLION IN OUR CHILDREN'S FUTURE**

The 37th Annual Celebrity Banquet benefiting Clearwater for Youth took place on February 27th at the Sheraton Sand Key Resort. The event was emceed by former sports anchor and senior advisor to the Tampa Bay Rays, Dick Crippen.

Clearwater for Youth is a non-profit organization dedicated to removing financial barriers which might prevent children from playing sports because they cannot afford to participate. Clearwater for Youth encourages sports in the community by offering scholarship opportunities, grants and matching funds to youth programs and participants in need.

During the Celebrity Banquet, legendary boxing coach Angelo Dundee was honored with the Frederick E. Fisher Humanitarian Award. Throughout his fascinating career, Dundee has coached some of the top names in boxing, including Muhammad Ali, Sugar Ray Leonard, and George Foreman.

Jamie Moyer and his wife Karen received the J. Warren Hughes Champion for Youth Award. Not only is Moyer an All-Star Major League Baseball pitcher (currently pitching for the Phillies), but he has given back to the community through the Moyer Foundation, which he co-founded with his wife. The Moyer Foundation's mission is "to offer encouragement, comfort and support to children enduring a time of profound emotional, physical or financial distress."


In the past year, Clearwater for Youth raised \$1.2 million, which makes 2009 the biggest fundraising year for Clearwater for Youth to date. The year was started out on the right foot with a generous donation of \$700,000 from Richard O. "Dick" Jacobson made at last year's Celebrity Banquet. In this year's banquet over \$50,000 has been raised.

Donations are used to provide hundreds of scholarships, travel grants and equipment for children who would not normally be able to afford it. Because of Clearwater for Youth, thousands of children throughout the Clearwater region have been able to participate in activities such as football, cheerleading, track & field, basketball and swimming.

Clearwater for Youth began in 1967 as a Kiwanis project and was developed into a non-profit in 1972. eginning in March, Pinellas County residents will receive their 2010 Census forms in the mail. The census data are important because they are used in determining congressional and legislative districts as well as determining funding for schools, housing, roads, and more. The form is shorter this year than in 2000, and is comprised of only 10 questions. Residents are asked to fill out the form and return it by U.S. mail. If forms are not received by April 1, 2010, census workers will begin visiting those households that did not return their forms. These visits will occur from April through July, 2010. Federal law mandates that individual responses are confidential.

As simple as this process is, criminals still find ways to victimize members of the public. The Pinellas County Sheriff's Office, along with Pinellas County Justice and Consumer Services and other local law enforcement agencies, are united in their mission to make the public aware

that even the census can be a tool for criminals to engage in identity theft, fraud and burglary.

First of all, census workers are not contacting anyone by email or through the internet. Do not respond to any census-related inquiries online. All forms will be sent by U.S. mail. Look twice at any communication by email or U.S. mail using the word "census" to promote an unrelated event or fund raiser. The official federal census forms do not solicit donations for or promote any organization or cause.

According to investigators with Pinellas County Justice and Consumer Services, "Legitimate census workers conducting neighborhood visits will carry an identification badge, a hand-held device, a Census Bureau logo canvas bag and a confidentiality notice." If someone claiming to be a census worker comes to your door, ask for identification and do not allow that person inside. Official census workers are to remain outside to conduct their resident contacts. They will not ask you to "use the bathroom" or "to make a phone call."

Assigned census workers are knocking on doors to verify address information. They might ask for a salary range in the household, but no other financial information will be sought. Be suspicious of any "census" worker who asks for your credit card or banking information, your social security number, or who solicits donations.

Official census workers may make contact by phone, and if you are concerned, you can confirm their identity and affiliation with the Census Bureau by calling 1-800-432-1495.

learwater, in a relatively small turnout on March 9th, voted to ▶ keep a city council incumbent and reelect a former city council member.

The Seat 4 race proved to be an interesting one, with four men competing for the vacant seat left by Carlen Peterson,

Bill Jonson, Seat 4

who termed out. Three concerned citizens and political newcomers, Wayne Carothers, Joe Paige, and Herb Quintero, ran against the experienced Bill Jonson, with Jonson winning with 54.72% of the vote.

It was an uphill battle for the men who ran against Jonson, in an overcrowded race in which they were outspent and "out-experienced" by Jonson, who had formerly served on the city council. Paul Gibson, who was also running for office in the current election, had previously re-

Quintero came in second with 16.88%, Joe Paige with 15.44%, and lastly, Wayne Carothers with 12.96% of the vote.

placed Jonson.

Incumbent Paul Gibson fought to keep Seat 5 against business owner Mike Riordon, someone



with fresh and innovative ideas for Clearwater. Ultimately, Gibson won with 57.26% of the vote. Riordon showed possibly the most growth as a candidate throughout the campaign season.

A Charter Amendment on the ballot changing how city auditors would be hired was defeated with 59.77% voting against.

A City Council Oath Session will be held on March 18th at City Hall. ◆

## SMALL BUSINESS OWNERS: AVOID THE SPAM BOX BY CHOOSING THE RIGHT EMAIL ADDRESS

Choosing the right email address as a small business owner is a vital step in setting up the communication lines for the company. There are several criteria that must be met:

- High availability of the email server. Nobody can afford to not be able to send or receive because the email service is down.
- Ability to receive ALL email (even if it's spam). Email addresses that use too much spam filtering will lose legitimate emails. It's better to filter for spam in your email program than to have your email provider filter for you.
- Ability to be able to send whatever email you choose to send. Some email providers filter outbound email and won't tell you why they deem the email inappropriate.

On top of these vital criteria come other important factors, like the recognition of your email as being connected to your business, ability to send legitimate marketing emails (mass email), etc.

As a small business, we have dealt with all of the issues stated above. Of course, nobody wants spam in his in-box, but the definition of what spam is varies greatly according to whom you ask. As an example, we send an email test to accounts on Yahoo.com, MSN.com, Gmail. com, etc. There was a great variation in where the email ended up. This email contained the word "Test" in the subject line and the words "this is a testy" in the body followed by a signature with the company's address, phone number, etc. Here is what happened with that email:

Yahoo.com in-box, but delayed two hours

MSN.com spam box Gmail.com in-box

RR.com never arrived and no bounce

message

Verizon.net spam box, but delayed two

hours

This is a rather widespread result and might be different for your email address. We then had to look deeper into it, especially into sending to RR.com email users. So we tested by reducing what's in that test email. After we removed our phone number, the email to RR.com did go through and was delivered to the spam box.

Now we were wondering why that was?

After a little thinking we came to this conclusion:

We are sending out marketing emails to our mailing list, and to comply with the ICANN spam law we have our phone number in our mar-

emails. So RR seems to identify spam by counting emails sent containing a certain phone number. Remember, these are our individual results and we are not claiming anything. However, since then we had two clients who ran into the same snag—with different providers, but same effect.

#### Which leads to this advice:

- Get your own domain name like yourcompany.com or whatyoudo. com. Use this email solely for 1-to-1 communication with your clients, leads or customers.
- Get another domain like yourcompanymarketing.com or whatyoudomarketing.com and set it up on a different hosting provider. Use that email solely for sending marketing emails.

The first one should be the same domain that your website is on and will be used for your day-to-day communication. (If you don't have a website, you should get one fast, seriously—that's a cost-effective way of gaining new clients.)

In addition to spam filters being triggered by content, they can also be triggered at some providers simply by the larger volume of marketing emails sent from one email address alone. So you run the risk of your normal communications being cut off if you use that address for your marketing email. Using a different domain for the marketing emails will most likely keep your main communication untouched.

#### What you should never do:

DO NOT USE one of the big companies like RR.com or Yahoo as your email provider. Most likely you will end up as one of our

clients did: "Help, I am not receiving emails.... I lost a big customer because I did not get his email!" We investigated the problem and found out that RR.com was blocking emails sent to the client's RR.com mailbox. Unfortunately that was their main email account.

#### What you should do:

USE your own domain and find a reputable hosting company and use that as your main email accounts. We are here to help with this (and also to get you an affordable web site if you don't have one).

And yes, we tried resolving the problems we had with the major providers, but they justified their practices by saying, "In order to fight spam, we know that legitimate email is affected." This does not help you at all, especially since you don't know if you are missing out on emails or not!

#### Conclusion

As every big email or internet provider nowadays is trying to keep spam down and therefore taking the risk to target legitimate email as spam, it is advised to NOT use them as the provider for your main business email. It's much better to have the spam AND that important email in your in-box than not getting the spam AND NOT getting that important email.

It only takes the delete key to get rid of the spam but it takes a lot more to repair a customer relationship.

#### **TOP-OF-THE-LINE RECORDING STUDIO OPENS IN DOWNTOWN CLEARWATER**

Tucked away on Franklin Avenue is an unexpected artist's haven in downtown Clearwater. The newly opened Clear Track Productions, a world class sound recording studio, features state-of-the-art equipment.

Musician and sound engineer Mike Johnson had been recording and mixing sound professionally since 2002, but was tired of being stuck with a sub-par product because he was using a sub-par facility.

"My ears are useless if I'm not hearing the truth," he says.

Realizing how important recording rooms are, Johnson began a quest for precision and perfection, and decided to build his own studio.

"I've built home studios wherever I've lived. As I grew as an engineer and musician, my standards for recording grew as well, culminating in this exact studio. I've created a place that makes me not only want to record my own music, but to share the opportunity with other musicians as well," says Johnson.

"I knew if I was going to make it all worth it, I would need to do it 100% right, all the way," says Johnson. So he hired Wes Lachot of Wes Lachot Design to design Clear Track Productions. Lachot has recently reworked the acoustics of Electric Lady Studios in New York City, and designed studios in which artists such as Aerosmith, REM and The Dixie Chicks have recorded.

What makes Lachot a top designer is that he designs his studios to be acoustically correct first and foremost, rather than designing for aesthetics (which can lead to flaws in the quality of sound being recorded).

With Clear Track Productions, Lachot has managed to blend aesthetics with the practicality of an acoustically correct space by lining the walls with acoustic panels in a puzzle-like formation. These panels give the room a neutral sound, which means whichever instrument or sound is being recorded will remain true to that sound in the recording.

"Once you walk through Studio A's oak door, you immediately step into another world," Johnson's wife Elizabeth describes. "Anyone can feel how much care went into creating this place."

Studio A comes with a tropical-themed private lounge, complete with a kitchenette, entertainment center, and miniature carp pond, offering both privacy and relaxation during the recording process.

"It's as good as it gets," says Johnson.

Johnson did not skimp on equipment quality either, opting to use tape rather than digital to record on. Clear Track Productions utilizes a recent piece of equipment called CLASP, which allows recorders to have the "ease of digital with the sound of analog from actual tape," says Johnson. This equipment allows artists to record on tape free of charge.

Not even a week into the studio's opening, two projects have already been underway, filling up both the A studio and the B studio. Artist Hana-Li is recording her album in Studio A, and Studio B is occupied by a fundraising album produced by the Tampa Bay Informer's own Sirio Balmelli.

"It's so pro," says Hana-Li of the studio.

"People are welcome to tour," says Elizabeth. "Just call." The number is (727) 449-8888 or (866)963-3108 toll free.

#### 2.5 MILLION LIGHT-YEARS...

recently launched NASA spacecraft is enabling us to know more about the universe we live in. The Wide-field Infrared Survey Explorer, known as WISE, is now gathering infrared images of our universe to help NASA scientists glean more information about the great unknown territory beyond our atmosphere.

Nearly a quarter of a million images have been returned since WISE's scan of the entire sky began on January 14th of this year. Some are from as far as the Fornax cluster, a cluster of galaxies 60 million light-years away.

"WISE has worked superbly" says Ed Weiler, the associate administrator of the Science Mission Directorate at the NASA Headquarters in Washington.

WISE has also returned images from our neighboring galaxy, the Andromeda spiral galaxy, which is 2.5 million light-years away. The images reveal other smaller galaxies close to Andromeda which belong to a "local group" of more than 50 galaxies, including our own. WISE is expected to capture images of the entire group.

"All these pictures tell a story about our dusty origins and destiny," explains Peter Eisenhardt, the WISE project scientist at NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory.


"WISE sees dusty comets and rocky asteroids tracing the formation and evolution of our solar system. We can map thousands of forming and dying solar systems across our entire galaxy. We can see patterns of star formations across other galaxies, and waves of starbursting galaxies in clusters millions of light-years away."

WISE's image-gathering mission is a precursor to WISE's secondary mission of tracking asteroids, comets and other stellar objects. This "will be just as critically important as its primary mission of surveying the entire sky in infrared," says Weiler.

of person." Videos of each of the thirty human rights, as well as the United Nations Declaration of Human Rights, can be found on youthforhumanrights.org.

After the walkathon, speakers and entertainment took stage in North Straub Park, and participants visited booths which featured information from human rights groups, religious organizations and various non-profits.

Speakers included James M. Evans of the Tampa Bay Academy of Hope, Dustin McGahee of Youth for Human Rights, and Rev. Alfreddie Johnson, pastor and founder of True Faith Christian Center in Compton, CA, and CEO and founder of the World Literacy Crusade.

"Together we have come together as

freedom fighters, community advocates, religious leaders...and human rights advocates," said Rev. Alfreddie Johnson, with passion and eloquence. "We are walking today not because our physicians have ordered us to get exercise."

"We are living in critical times...Something must be done, [and] now is the time," he said. He urged the audience to be aware of the barriers to freedom, which, he said, "Don't come from bankers, Jim Crow laws, greedy corporations or governments, but from the unwillingness to live by our rights, the unwillingness to face truth, and the dependency on the government to give us these rights."

Sprinkled in between speakers were performances from lively performers such

as the Dundu Dole African Urban Ballet, singer David Pomeranz, singer Hana Li, and Alyssa Suede, fresh from SXSW.

Larry Jaffe, the Poet Laureate for Youth for Human Rights, delivered a moving poem, "Owned," about human trafficking. "It's a beautiful day in St. Pete," said Jaffe before he began his poem, "but there are 23 million slaves in the world."

The highlight of the entertainment, however, was an engaging performance from dynamic female rapper MC Lyte. Not only is MC Lyte the first rapper with a gold record, the first solo female rapper with a Grammy, and the first rapper to perform at Carnegie Hall, but she is also a human rights advocate.

MC Lyte first got involved in human rights through Rev. Johnson and his church in Compton, and has been working in human rights for the past year and a half, showing human rights videos to children all over, specifically through Drug Free America and after school programs. "It's very important to me that they know what their rights are," says MC Lyte, "specifically human right #26, the right to an education. You deserve to be educated."



#### **HOW DOES THE COUNTYWIDE FERTILIZER ORDINANCE AFFECT YOU?**

PINELLAS COUNTY

The City of Clearwater

county-wide fertilizer ordinance recently went into effect to regulate the use of fertilizers in Pinellas County. What does this mean to you, as a Clearwater resident? It's not a fertilizer ban. You can still fertilize your lawn and gardens, but new regulations limit the types of fertilizers used during the summer, rainy months. Since Florida experiences such hot, long summers, this is when most residents water their lawns. It's important to know the new regulations, since they will help to reduce harmful nutrients (such as nitrogen and phosphorous) found in fertilizers and keep them from polluting our waterways.

This ordinance restricts the amounts of fertilizer used that can run off lawns and drains, which flow into the city's storm drains, ponds, creeks, rivers, canals, and eventually to Tampa Bay and the Gulf of Mexico. Excessive fertilizer use—after it drains to the bay—can cause algae blooms which suffocate fish, endanger marine wildlife, and deteriorate water quality.

If you plan to fertilize, here's what you need to know:

- Clearwater and all county residents may apply fertilizers to their lawns from Oct. 1 through May 31.
- Fertilizers containing nitrogen and/ or phosphorus cannot be applied to lawns or landscape plants from June 1 to September 30.
- Don't apply fertilizer if the National Weather Service has issued a weather

advisory in Pinellas County for events like severe thunderstorms, floods, tropical storms, or if rains greater than two inches in a 24-hour period is predicted.

- Fertilizer with nitrogen cannot be applied on newly established lawns or landscape plants for the first 30 days.
- If granular fertilizers containing nitrogen are used, they must contain no less than 50 percent slow-release nitrogen, per guaranteed analysis label.
- Fertilizer cannot be applied or deposited onto any solid surface, such as driveways, sidewalks, and roads, nor can they be washed, swept, or blown off such surfaces into stormwater drains, ditches, roadways, or surface waters. If this occurs, the fertilizer must be immediately removed to the greatest extent possible.
- If using broadcast or rotary fertilizer spreaders, deflector shields must deflect fertilizer granules from all solid surfaces and surface waters.
- A fertilizer-free zone is a 10-foot buffer from a wetland, top of the bank of a surface water, or landward edge of a seawall. Fertilizer cannot be applied within this zone.


